WORSHIP SERVICE CHANGES

As was explained in [Pastor Dan's letter](#) on July 8, the Session has decided to require everyone who comes to our worship services to wear a mask for the entire time that they are in our church building (except when partaking of communion). If you need a mask one will be provided at the door. Exceptions will be made for those who can't wear a mask for health reasons, those who can't remove a mask without assistance; those who need to communicate with someone who is hearing-impaired; and children under the age of 2 years.

Beginning July 26, we will have a service at 8:30 am with extra precautions for those with health concerns and another service with the procedures and order of service we've been using so far this summer at 11:15 am.

Masks will be required at both services.
