THE BLESSINGS OF REDEMPTION

Westminster Shorter Catechism, Questions 45-52

Q. 45. What is the first commandment?

A. The first commandment is, "You shall have no other gods before Me."

Q. 46. What is required in the first commandment?

A. The first commandment requires us to know and acknowledge God as the only true God, and our God, and to worship and glorify Him accordingly.

Q. 47. What is forbidden in the first commandment?

A. The first commandment forbids denying or not worshiping and glorifying the true God as God, and our God; it also forbids giving of that worship and glory, which is due to Him alone, to anyone or anything else.

Q. 48. What are we especially taught by these words, "before Me," in the first commandment?

A. These words, "before Me," in the first commandment teach us that God, who sees all things, takes notice of and is very displeased with the sin of having any other god.

Q. 49. What is the second commandment?

A. The second commandment is, "You shall not make for yourself a carved image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. You shall not bow down to them or serve them, for I the Lord your God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children to the third and the fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing steadfast love to thousands of those who love Me and keep My commandments."

Q. 50. What is required in the second commandment?

A. The second commandment requires receiving, observing, and keeping pure and whole all the religious worship and ordinances that God has appointed in His Word.

Q. 51. What is forbidden in the second commandment?

A. The second commandment forbids worshiping of God by images, or any other way not appointed in His Word.

Q. 52. What are the reasons added to the second commandment?

A. The reasons added to the second commandment are God's sovereignty over us, His ownership in us, and the zeal He has for His own worship.
