Westminster Shorter Catechism, Questions 35

Q. 35. What is sanctification?

A. Sanctification is the work of God's free grace, whereby we are renewed in the whole man after the image of God, and are enabled more and more to die unto sin, and live unto righteousness.

Westminster Confession of Faith Chapter 13.2 and 3

Q. What more do we believe concerning sanctification?

A. This sanctification is throughout in the whole man, yet imperfect in this life: there abides still some remnants of corruption in us, whence arises a continual and irreconcilable war between the lust of the flesh and the desires of the Spirit. In which war, although the remaining corruption for a time may much prevail, yet, through the continual supply of strength from the sanctifying Spirit of Christ, the regenerate part does overcome: and so the saints grow in grace, perfecting holiness in the fear of God.
